## A P R O C L A M A T I O N:

FOR the difcovering and apprehending the Perfons who plundered and burnt the Ga/pee Schooner ; and barbaroully wounded and ill-treated Lieutenant William Dudingfton, commander of the faid Schooner.
$W H E R E \mathcal{A} S$, We bave received information that upon the soth Day of June laft, between the Hours of Twelve and One in the SMorning, in the Providence or Narraganfett river, in Our Colony of Rhode-Illand and Providence
 called the Captain and Head-Sheriff, in feveral armed Boats, attacked and Boarded Our Veffel called the Galpee Schooner, then lying at fingle eAnchor in the faid River, commanded by Our Lieutenant William Dudingfton, under the orders of Our Rear-eAdmiral John Montagu, and baving dangeroully mounded and barbaroully treated the faid William Dudingfton, took, plundered, and burrt the faid Schooner :

WE, to the Intent that faid outrageous and heinous Offenders may be difcovered, and brought to condign Punifhment, have thought fit, with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to iffue this Our Royal PROCLAMATION:

And We are hereby gracioully pleafed to promife, that if any Perfon or Perfons lhall difcover any other Perfon or Perfons concerned in the faid daring and heinous Offences above-mentioned, fo that he or they may be apprehended and brought to juftice, fuch Difcoverer lhall have and receive, as a Reward for fuch Difcovery, upon Conviction of each of the faid Offenders, the Sum of Five Hundred Pounds. And if any Perfon or Perfons fhall Difcover either of the faid Perfons who acted as, or called themfelves, or were called by their faid accomplices, the Head-Sheriff or the Captain, fo that they, or either of them, may be apprehended and brought to Punilhment, fuch Difcoverer fhall have and receive, as a Reward for fuch Difcovery, upon Conviction of either of the faid Perfons, the further Sum of Five Hundred Pounds, over and above the Sum of Five Hundred Pounds herein before promifed for the Difcovery and apprehending any of the other common Offenders above mentioned; and if any perfon or perfons concerned therein, except the two perfons who were called the Head-Sheriff and Captain, and the Perfon or Perfons who wounded faid Lieutenant William Duding/ton, fhall difcover any one or more of the faid Accomplices, fo that he or they may be apprehended and brought to Punilhment, fuch Difcoverer fhall have and receive the faid Reward or Rewards of Five Hundred Pounds or One Thoufand Pounds as the Cale may be : and allo Our gracious Pardon for his faid Offence; And the Commiflioners for executing the Office of Treafurer of Our Exchequer, are hereby required to make Payment accordingly of the faid Rewards. And we do hereby frrictly charge and command our Governors, Deputy Governors, Magiftrates, Officers, and all other Our Loving Subjects that they do ufe their utmoft Diligence, in their feveral Places and Capacities, to find out, difcover, and apprehend the faid Offenders, in Order to their being brought to Juftice. And we do hereby command that this Our Proclamation be printed and publifhed, in the ufual form, and affixed in the principal Places of Our Town of $\mathcal{N}$ enport, and other Towns in Our faid Colony, that none may pretend Ignorance.
